OUR PRESIDENT GENERAL COMING TO PHOENIX

Michael Thio, President General of the International Confederation of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, is coming to Phoenix. He has accepted Diocesan Council President Joe Riley's personal invitation to participate in the 2011 Western Regional Meeting to be held here May 11-15.

"We are greatly blessed and honored to have Michael Thio joining us for this important event," President Riley said. "This exceedingly humble and exceptionally qualified man from Singapore, who has been a Vincentian for 45 years, epitomizes the concept of servant leadership and has such great love for the poor." Joe noted that "In addition to his deep spirituality Michael brings an impressive business background to his global responsibilities, having served, for example, as President of British Telecom in Southeast Asia."

Our President General is very much looking forward to being with the Vincentians of Phoenix and the Western Region. In an e-mail to Joe Riley, he stated that the most important part of his visit "is to meet our dear Vincentians and share with them as much as I can of our wonderful apostolate of Charity in living out our Christian Faith of Love as living witnesses of Christ – 'Deus Caritas Est' (God is Love)."

President General Thio will address Vincentians during a general session at the Hyatt Regency on the morning of Saturday, May 14. They also will have an opportunity to meet him during a special reception on the Watkins campus Friday night and at the final banquet Saturday evening.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

During the past year Vincentians in the conferences of the Phoenix Diocesan Council visited nearly 95,000 homes, devoted more than 600,000 hours to their labors of love and provided more than \$4.2 million in direct assistance to those in need.

These numbers are indeed impressive but their real significance lies in what they represent: your caring encounters with the poor as you performed your miracles of personal compassion. They speak eloquently of those grace-filled times throughout the year when you were the hands and feet, the eyes, ears, voice and, yes, the smiling face of Christ as you answered the phone, sorted the food, stocked the shelves, packed the food boxes, visited the poor in their homes and prayed with them.

As the basic unit of the Society, our conferences form the enduring foundation of our service to the needy. Christian servanthood is a decision to live the life of Jesus. It has nothing to do with what we feel, and everything to do with what we do. Our Lord understands the difficulties we frequently confront in doing His work. Every moment of our actions on behalf of His children in need – including the weariness, the frustration, the anxiety – is blessed by God. I think of His boundless gratitude as the perfect incentive for patience and perseverance on our part.

The unglamorous, usually little-noticed works of mercy central to our mission embody the lifestyle of the Kingdom of God. How blessed we are to be intimately involved with something so close to the heart of Him who has called us to continue His own ministry to the poor.

It is a great joy for me to contemplate what I call our magnificent challenge as Vincentians: to share every day in every possible way with our brothers and sisters in Christ the wonderfully unconditional love of God.

The exemplary love of neighbor you display each day transforms the lives of those you serve, while transforming your own life as well. That is what our Vincentian vocation is all about. That is what St. Vincent and Blessed Frederic were all about. And that is an inspiring thing to think about.

New Beginnings

Traditionally, January, the beginning of the New Year, is the time that people choose to re-make their lives. It is in this month that diets are started, exercise plans go into effect, new regimens are begun, new disciplines are tried, new forms of spirituality are tested, and millions of resolutions are made and broken. January is the time when you reflect on the past and resolve to make the future better.

As Catholics, we are called to grow closer to God in all we do. As humans, we tend to not live up to that calling. There is so much in life, so much in this world, that distracts us from where we should be: spiritually, emotionally and physically. The sad fact is that none of us, not a single one of us, are exempt from the need to change and make ourselves better.

Our focus here is not about diets or exercise plans or a thousand and one different resolutions. It is about making ourselves better spiritually. It is about growing closer to God. On June 30, 1990, Pope John Paul II shared this reflection with us: *“Strive to be witnesses of Christ’s love by putting into practice His Word of Life.*

- *When you help your neighbor, whoever he is, you proclaim the Good News of Christ, which makes universal brotherhood possible.*
 - *When you visit a sick person, you are a sign of Christ’s mercy toward those who suffer.*
 - *When you forgive, even your worst enemy, you are a sign of the forgiveness of Christ, who never nourished hatred in his heart.*
 - *When you refuse to accuse someone without proof, you proclaim the coming of the Kingdom of God and His justice, and no one is excluded.*
 - *When, as Christian spouses, you remain faithful in marriage, you are an encouragement to all and a sign of the eternal covenant of love between God and man.*
 - *When, as a young man or a young woman, you save yourself for the one who will be your spouse, you are a testimony of the unique value that love can construct.*
 - *When you radiate Christ, you awaken a desire for total self-giving in His service and inspire new priestly and religious vocations.*
- When, in the light, you call evil that which is evil and refuse to practice it, you are witnesses of Christ’s Light.”*

As Vincentians, we are called to be “witnesses of Christ’s love” to all those we encounter. Yes, we strive to find Christ in those we meet and serve; but, our hope is also that those we meet and serve will see Christ in us. Within the list of possibilities that Pope John Paul II gave us above, Vincentians have more opportunities to be witnesses of Christ’s love than most other people. Read them over again carefully and you will see what I mean.

So, while January is the traditional time for new beginnings, it is not the only time. The time for new beginnings is when you are ready, when you recognize that something needs to change, when you have reached a point that says now is the time. Well, think carefully about it and pray about it because now is the time.

St. Vincent De Paul in need of 300 more turkeys

St. Vincent De Paul is looking to collect 300 or more donated turkeys to provide Christmas dinner for needy families in Lake Havasu City.

"We are short of turkeys — at least 300 or more. We didn't get turkeys like we did last year," said Karen Ewing, St. Vincent De Paul general manager.

Last year, 600 turkeys were donated. This year, so far, less than 300 have been given, said Ewing.

"We have over 600 (needy) families," Ewing said. "If there were more reasonable prices, I would love to just buy (turkeys). But I just haven't found any really good sales."

Ewing said the organization has purchased a few turkeys for this year's cause, but funds are limited.

St. Vincent De Paul will deliver Christmas dinner food boxes Dec. 23. The organization is hoping to collect turkey donations prior to delivery.

Turkeys can be donated at St. Vincent De Paul's main thrift store between 7:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday at 1851 Commander Drive. For more information contact Ewing at 928-453-3125.

Food program short for New Year

Three hundred hams and 96 turkeys were recently donated to St. Vincent De Paul's family-in-need holiday food programs to make ends meet for 600 participating families in Lake Havasu City.

"We will be OK for Christmas, but we are short (on food) for the first of the year," said Karen Ewing, manager of St. Vincent De Paul.

On Wednesday, the Lake Havasu City Rotary Club stepped forward with 96 turkeys, valued at \$765, for the program after St. Vincent De Paul notified the community of their need.

Also, Salvation Army's Maj. Larry

Feist recently handed more than 300 hams, with an unspecified value, to help fill the need.

Salvation Army and St. Vincent De Paul work closely together throughout the year to help needy families in Havasu.

On Dec. 17, Donna Imhausen, of Havasu Realtors Charitable Assistance, presented a check for \$667 to St. Vincent De Paul president Ron Woods and Ewing.

Janet was referred by a case manager at the Justa Center in August of 2009. She had become homeless due to losing her job and without income she soon lost her housing. During her fifteen months at Ozanam Manor, Janet met weekly with her case manager on goals and objectives; she also went to school to upgrade her skills and searched for work. Janet had a set back due to knee injuries, but was soon on the mend and back looking for work. Janet was able to secure permanent full time employment as a home healthcare provider in Scottsdale and save for an apartment of her own.

On December 23, 2010 Janet successfully completed the program and moved out of Ozanam Manor and into her own apartment. She stated to her case manager how happy she was to have completed the program and to live independently once again.

Catholic Social Ministry Meeting

5 members of Voice of the Poor will be attending this meeting, held in Washington D.C. February 13-16. The theme of this year's meeting is Protecting Human Life and Dignity and Promoting a Just Economy. In addition to the 5 VOP members, 3 individuals from the Diocese of Phoenix will also be in attendance. VOP will have a workshop at this event, and one day is devoted to meeting with our elected officials in both the House and Senate.

Proposed Cuts to AHCCCS

The Arizona legislature has proposed cuts to AHCCCS, the state's Medicaid program, and has asked federal officials for permission to cut 280,000 people from this low-income health program via a waiver request. The position of VOP and the board of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is that we oppose any funding cuts to the current AHCCCS program.

Kino Border Initiative

VOP members Ron Meyer and Lucy Howell working on an upcoming fundraising dinner for KBI, the ministry that Jesuit Refugee Services has set up on the U.S./Mexican border in Nogales. KBI offers both spiritual support to those recently deported as well as nourishment and other aid. The event is planned for March 12, 2011. Although this is not a VOP or SVdP event, we felt that Vincentians would have in interest in this Jesuit ministry. Contact Lucy Howell if there is interest in attending 602-695-1604.

Building Bridges Immigration Forum

Building Bridges is a new program run jointly by St. Francis Xavier Parish and Brophy High School. The main purpose of this forum is to encourage dialog and work for a more just and humane approach to our current immigration system that is more consistent with the proposals of the U.S. Bishops and their "Justice for Immigrants Campaign". Work has begun on ideas for moving forward with constructive ideas and plans to engage other faith-based groups in this mission. 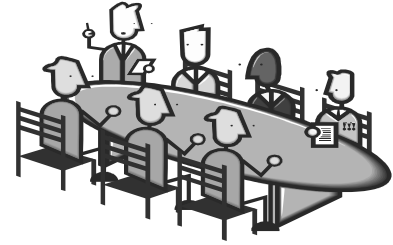

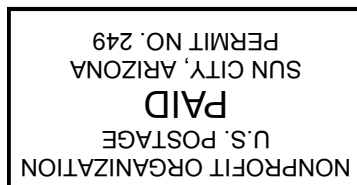
