## Help for Working Families

Emergency rent and utility assistance is offered to families living paycheck to paycheck, thereby avoiding eviction and homelessness during a crisis. We offer long-term job development and case management in order to help move the family into a more sustainable financial position.

## 16 Thrift Stores

Each day our trucks travel throughout the community picking up donated household goods and clothing. These goods are processed and sent out to our thrift stores. We operate 16 thrift stores in central and northern Arizona, where people in need – and the general public – can shop for low-cost clothing, furniture and household items. The stores also operate as neighborhood distribution centers where the people we serve can receive needed items free of charge. Proceeds from our stores help fund our programs for the poor. Ozzie's Furnishings, differs from our other stores. In this boutique, we sell some of the more unique donated items, including antiques and other elegant furnishings.

## Improving our Community

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul in Phoenix has continued to be a trusted and caring friend to communities in central and northern Arizona since its beginning in 1946. For our neighbors in need, we offer solutions – a free meal for the hungry family, a desperately needed job referral for the single mother, and necessary dental care to the child with uninsured working parents. And for the community, St. Vincent de Paul offers something equally important: a place where people can make a difference. Through us, people who care can give of themselves, serve others, and share important experiences with their children. With the help of thousands of donors and volunteers each year, we are able to reach out and improve our communities – one life at a time. If you would like to help, we invite you to support us with your time or donations. It may be the easiest and most satisfying way to truly make our world better.

## Thousands of Essential Meals for the Hungry

With one of the largest industrial kitchens in the southwest, six charity dining rooms and a food bank that serves central and northern Arizona, St. Vincent de Paul is able to provide 1.3 million hot meals and as many as 500,000 food boxes to hungry families and individuals each year.

### Dining Rooms

St. Vincent de Paul prepares more than 3,500 hot meals daily to feed the hungry in our five Phoenix dining rooms and at 12 other non-profit agencies. The dining rooms are strategically located throughout the Valley, from Mesa to El Mirage, to be easily accessible to the people who need them most. Educational programs for children are offered in our families-only dining room.



### Food Reclamation Center

Each day, truckloads of food arrive at St. Vincent de Paul, donated by grocery stores and community food drives. The items are sorted and measured against strict quality control standards before they are sent to our kitchen or divided into food boxes for hungry families.

## Meaningful Help for the Homeless

Through professionally run programs, St. Vincent de Paul helps the homeless work their way back to self-sufficiency. Our ongoing support helps keep at-risk families from becoming homeless.

### Ozanam Manor Shelter

This 49-bed transitional shelter provides a place for homeless adults – age 50 and above and those with disabilities – to work toward securing independent, permanent housing. Professional one-on-one case management, mentoring, group activities and other goal-setting programs help residents develop the skills and resources they will need for independent living.

### Ministry to the Homeless

With the help of skilled and caring volunteers, St. Vincent de Paul serves more than 100 homeless individuals each day, providing showers, clothing and haircuts, bikes and bus tickets, job leads and case management to inspire our clients to make real changes in their lives.

### SVdP Opportunity Program

This special program offers homeless individuals job training and work experience through on-site volunteer work at St. Vincent de Paul, as well as a mentoring relationship with a volunteer to help them successfully enter the workforce.

## Health Care for the Forgotten

In our St. Vincent de Paul Virginia G. Piper Medical and Dental Clinic, more than 160 physicians and dentists volunteer their time each year to ensure that low-income, working families who cannot afford insurance coverage have access to basic health care. We handle more than 13,000 patient visits annually. Aided by the generosity of local hospitals, pharmacies, laboratories and other agencies, the medical clinic is able to provide services ranging from treating colds to diabetic prevention and simple surgeries.



We offer a full children's treatment plan and teach oral hygiene skills to children who may never have visited a dentist. Adult dental services, from cleanings to fitting dentures, are available to all who qualify.

## Specialized Assistance Programs

### Conferences of Charity

Members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, called Vincentians, reach out through 87 parish-based conferences to provide person-to-person services for those in need. Whether it is to deliver a food box to individuals in their homes or provide other assistance, Vincentians are there to reach out in times of crisis.

### Ministry to the Incarcerated

For releasees and families with incarcerated members, mentoring, emotional and financial support are offered to help prevent homelessness.

### Transient Aid Center

Assistance is given to non-residents who find themselves stranded due to vehicle problems, abandonment, or the loss of job opportunities. We offer transportation, gas and food to help them reach a destination where they can thrive.
