Society of St. Vincent de Paul Names New Medical Director for Virginia G. Piper Medical & Dental Clinic

Phoenix – The Society of St. Vincent de Paul announces the appointment of Dr. Eugenie V. Anderson, M.D., as the new Medical Director of the Virginia G. Piper Medical & Dental Clinic.

As medical director, Dr. Anderson will oversee patient care and coordinate more than 60 volunteer doctors who provide the medical services at the Clinic. The Clinic provides medical care for working poor individuals who have no access to health insurance.

“We are thrilled have Dr. Anderson join our staff. She has been a volunteer at the Clinic for almost five years, providing specialized services to patients who had no other access to medical care. She has focused on treating the whole patient, which fits well with our Clinic’s philosophy,” said Steve Zabilski, Executive Director of the Society.

In addition to her appointment, Dr. Anderson operates her own practice, Woman to Woman Total Care, a gynecological practice in the Phoenix area.

Prior to starting her own practice in 1983, Dr. Anderson served as Chief Resident at Maricopa Medical Center. She also has served as a consulting physician for the Federal Bureau of Prisons and the Clinica Adelante in El Mirage, which serves low-income patients.

Dr. Anderson received her Bachelor’s Degree in Math and German from Syracuse University and received her Medical Degree from John Hopkins University School of Medicine. She is a member of the Maricopa Medical Society, American Society of Bariatric Physicians, Association of American Physicians and Surgeons, and the National Medical Association.

Dr. Anderson will succeed Dr. Earl Baker, who helped establish the Clinic and has retired as Medical Director after 14 years at the Clinic.

The Virginia G. Piper Medical & Dental Clinic is the most comprehensive charity clinic in the state, providing treatment to low-income, working poor individuals who would otherwise not have access to medical care. Approximately 13,000 medical and dental visits are completed each year, with the total value estimated at more than \$2 million.
