Some of our members took bags of food, milk, drinks, and other items donated by St. Anthony's parishioners. A pickup truck-full was delivered to the library in Aguila where the four families are able to collect aid.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Living in Truth

“Men in general are quick to believe that which they wish to be true” is a quote attributed to Julius Caesar. You would think in the ensuing 2000 years, which included the “Age of Enlightenment”, we would have become more discerning about the validity of our beliefs. Yet still today, millions of Americans are more than willing to embrace various conspiracy theories if they align with their personal politics or religious beliefs.

How often have we heard someone quote the Constitution or the Bible out of context in support of some belief they are espousing? In a culture that celebrates winning more than living a life of integrity, truth has become a devalued commodity. If the truth does not advance your personal agenda, simply embrace “alternative facts”. While doing so may be politically expedient, it is completely inconsistent with how we are called to live as Vincentians.

St. Vincent said, “Humility is nothing but truth, and pride is nothing but lying.” Our Rule says Frederick Ozanam “had a passion for truth.” I admit, as I grow older, I am less certain about things than I was in my youth. I have more questions than answers. The world is less black and white than it once appeared. Truth is not always readily apparent. But when I look in the mirror, or into my heart, what is very apparent is whether I am honestly seeking what is true or simply trying to rationalize my behavior or professed beliefs.

St. Ignatius insisted that his followers, the Jesuits, undergo an Examen of Conscience at the beginning and end of each day, to help ensure their hearts were aligned with God. It’s a practice we could all benefit from. Jesus said, “The truth shall set you free.” May we be a people who walk in the light of truth and heed Shakespeare’s counsel spoken by Polonius to his son Laertes, “This above all, to thine own self be true.”

Society of St. Vincent de Paul is founded in a deep sense of 360 degrees of incarnational theology. So, what does that mean? It means that as Vincentians we are called to see Christ everywhere. We seek to find Jesus in everyone and in all situations. Our vocation challenges us to see Him in the needy, the poor, the alienated, the vulnerable, our fellow Vincentians and even in ourselves. For most of us, finding Jesus outside of ourselves is easier than finding Him inside of us.

I recently visited an exhibit of masks and costumes used in ceremonies in the Congo. I was taken back by the explanation of how the different members of certain tribes put on a mask much like you and I are called to put on Christ. The explanation of masks and rituals located at the front of the exhibit stated that the identity of a masked performer for the most part is irrelevant, and that the persona of the mask only fully comes to life in a performance. The same can be said of our call to be Christ to one another.

In Galatians 2:20, St. Paul reminds us that it is no longer us who live, but Christ who lives in us. Each time we interact with the poor and the needy we are called to realize that we must be Christ and reflect His love and mercy to them. Since all Vincentians are called to put on Christ, to some extent our individual identities fade away so that the mantle of the Society and the face of Jesus are what others see and experience. We must also remember that the presence of Christ is most fully manifested in us as we live out our faith through service to others.



CAN OTHER PEOPLE SEE CHRIST IN YOU?

If our Lord walked among the sick, the poor, the sinners and the outcasts of society, His presence within us dictates that we must do the same. It is easy to forget that Jesus lives within us and to become judgmental when we remove ourselves from direct ministry to God's people. I am often unforgiving when I hear a person's story over the telephone but once I actually enter their home and sit beside them on the sofa, the love and mercy of God comes alive and beats deep within my heart. I suddenly find myself to a great degree fading away and the light of Christ being reflected through the ministry of the Society.

My prayer is that as we return to direct ministry that each of us will not only see the face of Christ in those whom we serve, but that we will put on the mantle of Christ so that the people we encounter will experience Christ through us. Christ is in you so let His love and mercy shine forth for all to see.

From the Desk of the Conference Resources Committee

Conference & Council Funds:

During the pandemic, many of our Phoenix Diocesan Conferences and Councils have been blessed with generous and increased financial donations. At the same time, calls for assistance and services have diminished. Faced with increased resources, larger than normal bank balances, and fewer calls, many Conferences and Councils are struggling to find ways to use their funds. Instead of saving for possible future needs, Conferences and Council should consider increasing the number of families that they serve and/or raising their maximum limits for assistance. When making decisions regarding the use of funds, Conferences and Councils must keep in mind that the funds we as a society receive are to be used for direct assistance to the poor and may not be given to other charities or organizations no matter how worthy the cause. (See excerpts from pages 26 & 27 of the Manual of the Society below.)

Donations to Conferences - whether they come from church collections, from the members themselves, from benefactors, or from fundraising efforts — are meant to address today's needs (Rule: Part III, Statute 25). It is wrong for a Conference to seek financial security by building up a large balance for the needs of the future. Conference balances generally should not exceed what they expect to spend during an average quarter. Surplus funds should be shared generously with more needy Conferences or the special works of the District Council (Rule: Part III, Statute 24).

Funds donated to the Conference must be used only for works that involve the personal service of members of the Society. As generous as the Conference should be to needy individuals, it cannot provide funds to causes outside of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, no matter how worthy they are. The Society does not raise money for activities in which its members are not personally and substantially involved. Above all, the intention of the donor, who chose to give to the Society, must prevail.

Co-Presidents:

Remember that co-presidencies are a last resort and highly discouraged for the Conferences in the SVdP Diocesan Council of Phoenix. Such positions are not recognized at the National level and can only be considered at the Conference level. If one of the Co-Presidents steps down, that person cannot be replaced during that term as the co-presidents were elected as one entity. It is also impossible for two people to be of one mind. Often one co-president carries more of the responsibilities of the office and the other just goes along with the stronger of the two. According to our current Conference bylaws, having co-presidents requires proof of a hardship and the advance approval of the District president.

The most effective slate of officers is a president with a strong vice-president. Keep in mind that the 1st vice president of any Conference or Council automatically assumes the duties of the president in his/her absence. It should also be noted that other officers may be re-appointed by an incoming president and that these positions have no term limits. It is, however, in the best interest of the group, to periodically change the people serving in those positions.



40th ANNUAL FALL CONFERENCE FOOD DRIVE

For the past 40 years the **Men of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (OLPH)** and the **OLPH SVdP Scottsdale Conference** have facilitated the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Food Drive materials. These Food Drive materials are distributed for Conference pantries. Over the years the food drive has grown to include some 70 or more SVDP conferences.

Food Drive supplies may be picked up on **Friday and Saturday, September 17th and 18th from 9:00am to 12:00pm** at 420 W. Watkins St. in Phoenix. All supplies can be picked up at the north door of the **Food Reclamation Center**.

Lucy Meraz (602-850-6761) will be sending out more information in August asking Conference Presidents to register and order their supplies.

Please check with **your Pastor** for his approval.

The Men OF OUR LADY of PERPETUAL HELP (Scottsdale) will be available to assist. The supplies will include **grocery bags, holy cards, envelopes, and flyers** suggesting appropriate types of food for donation by parishioners. Typically, these materials will be stapled together, distributed to parishioners one weekend, and returned with donations the following weekend.

This annual food drive allows parishioners to donate over **30,000 bags of food for our SVdP food pantries** each year. In addition, donations are made that provide for food to be purchased. **The total value to conference pantries is well in excess of \$1 million each year.** Please conduct a food drive for your own local use, or plan to donate your excess food to be picked up by another SVdP conference of your choice.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul National Assembly will be held in Houston, Texas August 25th through August 28th. Attending the regional and national meetings is a great way to learn more about the Society, to listen to inspiring speakers, to revitalize your vocational call, and to interface with Vincentians from across the United States.

The cost for registration for the full four days is \$375 if you register by July 15, \$425 if you register after July 15th and before August 15th and \$475 after August 15th. Hotel accommodation can be made at the Marriott Marquis Houston at a group rate of \$155 a night if your reservation is made before August 4th. The cost for this event may seem a little pricey but it is well worth the expense. It is important to note that conferences and councils may vote to pay for some or all of the expenses of their delegates and/or members. (See the National Q & A response to the reimbursement policies of the Society below.)

Being a Vincentian is not just about serving the poor. It is also about growing in holiness through not only service but through fellowship and being part of the larger Vincentian family. Learning, growing and building relationships with our brother and sister Vincentians from other areas of the United States enlivens and enriches us and our works. It helps us to see the bigger picture, to hear new ideas and to share our experiences in ways that may help others.

If attending the meeting doesn't seem that enticing, keep in mind that our Phoenix Diocesan Council is scheduled to host the 2022 National Assembly. Having a large delegation from Phoenix attending this one will provide us with valuable knowledge and insights into how we can make this event even better next year. Additionally, three of the workshop presenters for the Houston assembly will be from the greater Phoenix area, so why not attend and support them?

(National Q & A 4/17/2014 Page 24) - The Rule, Part III, Statute 28 states: *Vincentians entrusted to undertake previously and duly authorized offices, missions, or tasks for the Society are entitled to the refund of the expenses incurred. This is more than just an entitlement. Within the Spirit of the Society, all the works of the Society are works of the group and not the individual. If a member does not get reimbursed for expenses, the work becomes an individual effort and this often causes confusion when members then do what they want rather than what is agreed to by the Conference or Council. This does not directly address National and Regional meetings; however, in Part II of the RULE, International Statute 7.4: “Any matter that is not specifically governed by any Parts of the Rule and Statutes shall be governed by Tradition and, in the final instance, by the decision issued by the Board of the Council General.” That said, on page 136 of the 2002 version of the manual, it states: “In accord with the long established practice, the individual Councils and Isolated Conferences are expected to assume financial responsibility for their delegates and committee members to attend meetings as necessary.”*

Election Procedures for SVdP Conference or Council Presidents

Throughout the various levels of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, the only elected office is that of President. The newly elected President in consultation with the Conference or Council membership appoints all other officers. The outgoing President or the clergy of a given parish may not under any circumstances appoint a Conference or Council President.

The election of Conference and Council President is held by secret ballot in accordance with an approved set of procedures that are consistent with the Rule, Statutes and Bylaws of the Society.

The term of office of a Conference, District or Diocesan Council President is three years, once renewable... Once a President has served two consecutive three-year terms, that person will not be eligible for re-election as President until a three-year term has elapsed under a different President.

Each Conference or Council should have at least a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer all of which are appointed by the President after consultation with the members. The President may appoint other officers.

All officers appointed by the President serve at the pleasure of the President. Such appointment terminate automatically when a new President takes office. An incoming President may reappoint an officer or officers and others who served under the previous President. (Rule Part III: 12)

In most cases, the First Vice President of a Conference or Council serves as the chairman of a nominating committee. Depending on the size of the Council or Conference, two or four members should be appointed to serve on that committee. The purpose of the committee is to determine who is eligible and interested in becoming a Presidential candidate and to interface with Conference or Council members about Vincentians who they believe have demonstrated leadership qualities and shown an interest in becoming an officer. Potential candidates are contacted and asked if they are willing to run for the office of President. Individual Vincentians may also contact the nominating committee and express their interest in running for office.

As soon as eligible candidates have been obtained, the date for an election must be set and all voting members must be notified of the upcoming election date. ***The President is then elected by secret ballot and only full-enhanced members who are present at the meeting may cast a ballot. No absentee ballots may be issued or counted.*** Once the process has been completed, arrangements should be made to commission the newly elected President.

In the Diocese of Phoenix, all newly elected Presidents take office on October 1st and serve through September 30th. In the event that a President resigns or otherwise vacates their office prior to the end of their term, an interim President is elected to serve until September 30. A new full term President is then elected to take office on October 1st. No interim Presidential term shall be counted in the term limit for a given Vincentian.

Strengthen us so that we may support our servant leaders in ways that lighten their load and enables them to know that they do not undertake the responsibilities of their office alone for we are but one family united in love and service.

Help us to grow in unity, fellowship and holiness so that our Conference/Council and its members may radiate your love and care for the poor, the needy, the vulnerable, the forgotten, and the entire world.

We ask all these things through the power of your Holy Spirit and in the name of Your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen
