- \cdot We are to go **BEYOND** and provide loving and compassionate interest in each person with whom we come in contact.

 Our belief is that help with food or money is only one level of our connection to the people we serve



1833 – Paris, France – Six Catholic college students and a mentor joined together to create the first conference

> St. Vincent de Paul is chosen as the patron saint for the group to emulate

Directed to "Go to the poor and suffering."

A Rule is written for the group in 1835 and modeled on what had been practiced in the first few years of operation.

SOCIETY'S CORE MISSION

Home Visit :

Respect those we are to serve by going
TO THEM rather than requiring them to come to us.



We recognize their dignity and find that they are much more open when we are on "their turf."

 (In some cases it is required that we conduct our visit Person-to-Person in a safe environment away from the home.)

CHANGE AS THE WORLD CHANGES

- During this time of a "New Normal" until it is considered safe to do home visits conferences may be handling their calls over the phone rather than an actual home visit.
- In Part 1 of our Rule 1.6 states "Faithful to the spirit of its founders, the Society constantly strives for renewal, adapting to changing world conditions."

Incorporate prayer into the visit and bring God's love to our neighbors in a special way.

Grow in fellowship – with our Vincentian family and with those we serve.

TWO PARTNERS—SAME MISSION

Over 3500 Volunteers from over 80 Conferences serving the needy across the Phoenix Diocese

Food boxes/bags, rent assistance, utilities, transportation, furniture, clothes, medical and dental, car repair, listening and other support

200 Staff

Medical/dental clinic, 18 thrift stores, 5 dining rooms, showers, clothing, counseling, tutoring, fresh produce, travel assistance

Together, as partners, the work is extended to over 1,550,000 people each year "No work of charity is foreign to the Society." (Rule 1.3)
